Make a Difference: VOTE Nov 2nd

This election, San Francisco will be using a new voting system called Ranked Choice Voting. To use RCV, voters simply rate the candidates they like in order of preference on their ballots. This system improves voting by:

- ◆ Making elections better: Voters are liberated to vote for the candidates they like, instead of the "lesser of two evils."
- ◆ Making elections cheaper: No more costly runoff elections.
- ◆ Making elections cleaner: Much more money is spent on runoffs by special interest "independent expenditures."
- ◆ Making elections more representative: The November election will be final, rather than the runoff, which has significantly lower turnout.

Ranked Choice Voting Guidelines:

- 1 Rank 3 DIFFERENT candidates, 1, 2, 3.
Mark your favorite candidate FIRST.
- 2 It's best to use ALL THREE of your rankings
- 3 Your second or third choices are your "backup" choices in case your first choice is eliminated.
- 4 Ranking the same candidate three times or ranking only one candidate ("bullet voting") does NOT help that candidate.
