Proposition B helps Muni keep up as San Francisco grows.

Prop B adjusts the City's budget for Muni to account for population growth. It will use these funds for day-to-day spending like fleet maintenance and more frequent buses and trains. Prop B will help Muni avoid service cuts, and instead increase service and provide new vehicles, while also paying for street and pedestrian safety improvements.

Prop B covers day-to-day costs that bonds like Prop A cannot.
